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THE ROLE OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN RANIA AL ABDULLAH IN DEVELOPING THE QUALITY OF EDUCATION IN JORDAN

Abstract

This study aimed to scrutinize the impact of Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah on improving the quality of education in Jordan through six main initiatives: the Jordan Education Initiative, the Queen Rania Teacher Academy, the Madrasati Initiative, Edraak, the Queen Rania Foundation for Education and Development, and the Queen Rania Award for Excellence in Education. Using a mixed-methods approach, the study combined both quantitative and qualitative data collection techniques. Data were gathered through survey questionnaires and focused group interviews. The sample of the study consisted of 514 teachers randomly selected from schools in Amman and 72 teachers who had directly benefited from Her Majesty's educational initiatives. The study's findings indicated that Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah plays a highly significant role in enhancing the quality of education in Jordan. The findings also revealed that Her initiatives have notably improved the educational experience for teachers by offering valuable resources, comprehensive training, and recognition. These efforts have contributed to the development of a more effective and supportive educational system in Jordan.

INTRODUCTION

Over the past several decades, Jordan has made significant strides in the development of its education system, aiming to provide quality education that meets the needs of its growing population. Since gaining independence in 1946, Jordan has prioritized education as a key pillar of national development, investing in infrastructure, curriculum reform, teacher training, and expanding access to schooling. This commitment is reflected in Jordan's National Strategy for Human Resource Development, which emphasizes the importance of education in fostering economic growth, social cohesion, and sustainable development (Ministry of Education of Jordan,

2021)

The expansion of education in Jordan has been marked by increased enrollment rates at all levels, from primary to tertiary education, supported by initiatives to improve access in rural and marginalized communities. Efforts have also focused on enhancing the quality of education through curriculum updates, modernizing teaching methods, and integrating technology into classrooms. These reforms are aimed at equipping students with the skills and knowledge needed to succeed in a globalized economy and to address the challenges of the 21st century (World Bank, 2020).

Despite progress, challenges remain, including disparities in educational quality between urban and rural areas, as well as ensuring inclusivity for students with disabilities and other marginalized groups. Jordan continues to work towards overcoming these challenges through targeted policies, partnerships with international organizations, and ongoing reforms aimed at building a more equitable and effective education system that prepares all students for future opportunities and challenges (UNESCO, 2020)

JEI's vision is to create a model for educational reform that can be replicated in other developing countries. The initiative aims to demonstrate how ICT can be used to enhance teaching and learning, reduce the digital divide, and provide equitable access to quality education for all students in Jordan. Ultimately, JEI aspires to contribute to the development of a knowledge-based society in Jordan.

Principles

The key principles guiding JEI include:

- **Innovation:** Leveraging the latest technological advancements to improve education.
- **Partnership:** Engaging a wide range of stakeholders, including government agencies, private sector companies, and international organizations, to support educational reform.

Born on August 31, 1970, in Kuwait, she was educated in Jordan and the United States, where she attended the Arabic School in Amman. She continued her education at the New English School in Kuwait, where she demonstrated academic excellence and leadership qualities. Her pursuit of higher education took her to Cairo, Egypt, where she enrolled at the American University in Cairo (AUC). At AUC, Queen Rania earned a bachelor's degree in business administration in 1991. Her academic background in business provided her with a solid foundation for her subsequent roles in both the private and public sectors.

Queen Rania is renowned for her advocacy on various social issues, particularly education, health, and women's rights. Since becoming Queen in 1999, she has been a prominent figure in Jordan, championing numerous initiatives aimed at improving the quality of education in the country.

The Quality of Education: it refers to the effectiveness and impact of educational systems and practices in providing students with meaningful and valuable learning experiences. It

encompasses various aspects that contribute to achieving desirable educational outcomes and ensuring that students receive a well-rounded and comprehensive education. Key components of the quality of education include Curriculum and Content, Teaching and Instruction, Learning Outcomes, Educational Resources, Assessment and Evaluation, Teacher Qualifications and Development, Inclusivity and Equity, Student Well-being, and Support Systems.

The Theoretical Framework

Definition of "Quality of education"

Literature defines the term quality in various ways. An online dictionary defines quality as a tool to compare any good or service of a property. In a modern definition, quality derives from fitness for intended use that indicates "meeting or exceeding customer expectation" (The National Education Association (NEA), 2006). Quality has two meanings: a product or service to satisfy the needs, and a product or service that is free of deficiencies (Volegzhanina et al., 2017). Mari & Bjørn (2018) summarize the definition of quality as (1) the degree to satisfy an attribute or requirement of an entity, e.g. process, product, or service; (2) comparing a set of inherent characteristics with a set of requirements; and (3) the degree to which a set of inherent characteristics fulfills requirements. To sum up, Shah, et al., (2011) define quality as an outcome to which a good or service is provided to satisfy a customer or stakeholders.

According to quality of education as it's known, there is no single definition for quality in Education and there is no universal consensus on what is the appropriate strategy to assure and manage quality; however, The Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary, (2010) defines it as the act or process of imparting or acquiring particular knowledge or skills, as for a profession, and quality as referring to character concerning fineness or grade of

excellence. However, the combination of these words may mean different things depending on the perception of one person by another. Also, Harvey & Green (1993) defines quality education as equipping learners with skills and knowledge that would help them develop psychologically and benefit them in the future, allowing them to employ the skills they learned in their day-to-day lives to sustain themselves even after graduation.

Education is widely recognized as a fundamental human right and a cornerstone of individual and societal development. However, the mere provision of education is not enough; its quality is paramount in determining its effectiveness and impact. This paper explores the multifaceted importance of quality in education, drawing upon key dimensions such as individual empowerment, social equity, economic development, societal cohesion, and global relevance.

of economic growth and reduced poverty levels. This underscores the transformative power of education in lifting individuals out of poverty and promoting social mobility.

Moreover, quality education prepares individuals for active citizenship and meaningful participation in democratic societies. It cultivates values such as tolerance, respect for diversity, and civic responsibility, contributing to the development of well-rounded individuals capable of contributing positively to their communities.

2. Promoting Social Inclusion and Equity

Beyond individual benefits, quality education is a catalyst for promoting social inclusion and equity. According to the European Commission (2021), equitable access to quality education is essential for breaking the cycle of intergenerational poverty and reducing disparities based on socio-economic background, gender, ethnicity, or disability.

Evidence from UNICEF (2020) underscores that inclusive education system that accommodates diverse learning needs and provides equal opportunities for all learners contribute to greater social cohesion and reduced inequalities. By ensuring that every child receives a quality education, societies can harness the full potential of their human capital, fostering a more just and equitable future.

3. Driving Economic Development and Global Competitiveness

Investments in quality education are crucial for driving economic development and enhancing global competitiveness. The OECD (2021) emphasizes that education systems that prioritize quality are better equipped to meet the evolving demands of the global economy, where skills such as digital literacy, innovation, and entrepreneurship are increasingly valued.

Countries with strong education systems not only attract foreign investment and promote innovation

but also ensure a skilled workforce capable of driving sustainable economic growth. This is evident in successful education reforms implemented in countries like Finland and South Korea, where a focus on quality education has contributed to their economic success on the global stage.

4. Fostering Societal Cohesion and Resilience

Quality education plays a pivotal role in fostering societal cohesion and resilience in the face of challenges such as social unrest, natural disasters, and global pandemics. According to UNESCO (2020), education systems that prioritize quality promote a sense of belonging and collective responsibility among citizens, thereby strengthening social bonds and fostering resilience in times of crisis.

Moreover, education that promotes values of tolerance, empathy, and respect for diversity helps mitigate social tensions and promote peaceful coexistence in culturally diverse societies. This is exemplified by educational initiatives aimed at promoting intercultural understanding and reconciliation in post-conflict regions, highlighting the transformative potential of quality education in promoting lasting peace and stability.

5. Ensuring Global Relevance and Sustainability

In an increasingly interconnected world facing complex global challenges such as climate change, technological advancement, and geopolitical shifts, quality education is essential for preparing future generations to navigate these challenges effectively. The World Economic Forum (2020) stresses that education systems must equip learners with the knowledge, skills, and ethical values necessary to contribute to sustainable development and global citizenship.

Quality education fosters environmental awareness, ethical responsibility, and a commitment to social justice, empowering

individuals to become agents of positive change in their communities and beyond. By promoting a culture of innovation and lifelong learning, quality education ensures that societies remain adaptable and resilient in the face of rapid technological advancements and evolving socio-economic landscapes.

How to Improve Quality in Education

Education is universally recognized as a cornerstone of individual development and societal progress. However, ensuring that education meets high standards of quality is essential to maximize its impact on learners and communities. Quality education goes beyond mere access; it encompasses effective teaching strategies, relevant curriculum design, supportive learning environments, and inclusive practices that cater to diverse learner needs. The following key strategies and approaches aimed at improving the quality of education, highlighting evidence-based practices and insights from educational research.

1. **Integration of Technology in the Classroom:** Incorporating technology into education can significantly enhance learning experiences. Digital tools such as interactive whiteboards, educational software, and online resources facilitate engaging and personalized instruction. Studies show that technology can improve student outcomes by providing immediate feedback and interactive content (Hattie, 2009). For instance, a meta-analysis found that technology use had a positive effect on student achievement, especially when used to support individualized learning.

2. **Professional Development for Teachers:** Continuous professional development is crucial for educators to stay abreast of new teaching strategies and advancements in their subject areas. Effective professional development programs are tailored to teachers' needs and emphasize practical, classroom-based skills. Research by

Darling-Hammond et al. (2017) highlights that high-quality professional development can lead to significant improvements in teaching practices and student learning outcomes. According to their findings, teachers who participate in ongoing, well-designed professional development are more effective in their classrooms.

3. **Curriculum Development and Relevance:** A well-developed curriculum that aligns with educational standards and incorporates real-world applications is essential for enhancing education quality. The curriculum should be flexible to meet diverse learning needs and incorporate critical thinking and problem-solving skills. The National Research Council (2012) emphasizes that curricula which integrate complex, real-world problems engage students more deeply and prepare them better for future challenges.

4. **Innovative Assessment Practices:** Effective assessment practices provide a comprehensive view of student progress and areas needing improvement. Traditional testing methods should be complemented by formative assessments, self-assessments, and peer reviews. Black and Wiliam (1998) argue that formative assessment practices, which involve ongoing feedback and adjustments to instruction, significantly improve student learning outcomes. Their research underscores the importance of using diverse assessment methods to better understand and support student needs.

5. **Creating an Inclusive School Environment:** A positive and inclusive school environment fosters respect, equity, and a sense of belonging among students. Schools should implement policies that address issues like bullying and discrimination while promoting inclusivity. According to the work of Tharp (2005), creating an inclusive environment is crucial for student engagement and success. Schools that focus on building a supportive community see improved student

behavior and academic performance.

6. **Enhancing Student Engagement:** Engaged students are more motivated and achieve better academic results. Strategies to increase engagement include incorporating hands-on activities, allowing student choice, and connecting lessons to real-life experiences. Fredricks, Blumenfeld, and Paris (2004) found that student engagement, which encompasses behavioral, emotional, and cognitive aspects, is strongly linked to academic achievement and motivation.

7. **Effective School Leadership:** Strong leadership is key to driving educational improvements. Effective school leaders create a vision for educational excellence and support teachers in achieving it. Leithwood et al. (2004) demonstrate that transformational leadership positively impacts student outcomes by fostering a collaborative culture and supporting professional development. Leaders who advocate for and implement effective practices and policies can significantly enhance educational quality.

8. **Ensuring Equitable Access to Education:** Addressing disparities in access to education is fundamental to improving quality for all students. This involves tackling barriers such as socioeconomic status, geographic location, and learning disabilities. The work of McKinsey & Company (2009) illustrates that targeted interventions and support programs can reduce educational inequities and improve outcomes for disadvantaged students. Ensuring that all students have access to the necessary resources and support is essential for a high-quality education system.

Methods and Procedures

This section elucidates all of the population, participants, and instruments, along with their reliability, validity, and data analysis.

The Population of the Study

The study population included all participants in Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah's educational initiative, which encompasses several key groups directly and indirectly involved in the educational reforms and initiatives led by Her Majesty Queen Rania. The study aims to explore her contributions to improving educational quality in Jordan through various perspectives and sources. The population of the survey includes:

Schools: A representative sample of schools that have directly benefited from Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah's initiatives. This includes schools supported by the Madrasati Initiative, the Queen Rania Teacher Academy, and other educational programs endorsed by Her Majesty. These schools have received various forms of support, such as infrastructure improvements, teacher training, and educational resources, aimed at enhancing the quality of education and fostering a more effective learning environment.

Students: students who have directly experienced the impact of educational reforms and initiatives led by Queen Rania, including those from schools and programs associated with her projects.

Educators: Teachers who have participated in training programs, professional development, or other educational initiatives introduced or supported by Queen Rania. This includes those from schools benefiting from the Queen Rania Teacher Academy and other related programs.

The Sample of the Study

The study sample comprised 514 teachers from schools in Amman, involved in six initiatives launched by Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah: the Jordan Education Initiative, the Queen Rania Teacher Academy, the Madrasati Initiative, Edraak Initiative, the Queen Rania Foundation for Education and Development, and The Queen Rania Award for Excellence in Education. The sample

was randomly selected to participate in the first instrument of the study, a questionnaire. For the second instrument, which was an interview, 72 teachers were randomly chosen to respond to seven questions about Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah's role in developing the quality of education in Jordan.

The Instruments of the Study

To explore the role of Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah in developing the quality of education in Jordan, the study employed two primary instruments:

1. Questionnaire:

Description: The first instrument was a structured questionnaire designed to gather quantitative data from teachers across Jordan which consisted of 30 closed items distributed over six dimensions (the Jordan Education Initiative, the Queen Rania Teacher Academy, the Madrasati Initiative, Edraak Initiative, the Queen Rania Foundation for Education and Development, and The Queen Rania Award for Excellence in Education).

Participants: A total of 514 teachers were randomly selected from schools across Jordan to complete the questionnaire. The sample was representative of the diverse educational settings involved in the initiatives.

Purpose: The questionnaire sought to collect data on various aspects such as the perceived effectiveness of the initiatives, improvements in teaching practices, and overall changes in the quality of education attributable to Her Majesty's efforts.

2. Focused Group Interviews:

Description: The second instrument was a semi-

structured interview designed to obtain in-depth qualitative insights into the role of Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah in educational development. The interviews included a set of seven key questions.

Participants: For the interviews, 72 teachers and school principals were randomly selected. This subset was chosen to provide a focused perspective on the impact of Her Majesty's initiatives from those who have been closely engaged with them.

Purpose: The interviews aimed to gather rich, qualitative data that would complement the quantitative findings from the questionnaire. They focused on understanding the personal experiences of the participants, their views on the effectiveness of the initiatives, and their opinions on Her Majesty's role in advancing educational quality.

Together, these instruments provided a comprehensive approach to examining the impact of Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah's initiatives on the quality of education in Jordan, combining broad quantitative data with detailed qualitative insights.

Validity of the Study

A jury of nine university professors specializing in the English language, academic and experts in the Ministry of Education moderated the study instruments to establish the validity of the questionnaire and the interview questions; their suggestions, comments, and recommendations were considered. Internal consistency validity was also applied to the exploratory sample (n = 30). Table 1 demonstrates the results as follows:

Seventy-two teachers were invited to participate in the focused group interviews. To increase the validity of this instrument, all interviews were transcribed, and each participant was allowed to review his transcript to ensure its accuracy. Furthermore, after each report was completed, each participant was allowed to review his case report. Participants were encouraged to provide comments and feedback to ensure that the study's analysis was accurate.

Reliability of the Study

The reliability of the questionnaire was assessed using statistical measures such as Cronbach's alpha, which evaluates the internal consistency of the questionnaire items. A high Cronbach's alpha coefficient indicated that the items consistently measure the intended constructs. Additionally, the Test-Re-Test method of analysis was used on 30 participants who were not involved in the study. The questionnaire was distributed to the exploratory sample, and two weeks later, the same tool was distributed to the same sample.

To ensure the reliability of the second instrument (the interview), the researcher reanalyzed the interview findings after two weeks to verify consistency with the original data. This process, known as inter-rater reliability, involved examining the data with a second rater. A comparison of the analyses performed by both raters was then conducted to ensure consistency and accuracy in the findings.

DATA ANALYSIS

The present study sought to scrutinize the role of Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah in developing the quality of education in Jordan through six initiatives. The quantitative data was collected from the closed items of the questionnaire, then, distributing a questionnaire to achieve study goals. After that, the data collected from the questionnaire was analyzed in terms of means, standard deviations, and t-tests using the

Statistical Package for Social Studies (SPSS).

Qualitative data were gathered through interviews, which were transcribed to facilitate accurate and comprehensive analysis. To ensure participant anonymity, each interviewee was assigned a code, such as (T1) for (Teacher 1). Each interview lasted approximately one hour. The transcribed interviews were analyzed thematically to identify key insights and patterns related to Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah’s initiatives.

FINDINGS AND DISCUSSION

Findings and Discussion Related to the First Question.

Q1: What level of role of Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah in Developing the Quality of Education in Jordan? To answer this question, Means & Std. Deviations were used as in table (3):

Table 3 indicates that the role of Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah in enhancing the quality

of education in Jordan is rated highly, with a mean score of 3.88 and a standard deviation of 0.37. Among the dimensions evaluated, the "Queen Rania Award for Excellence in Education (QRAEE)" achieved the highest ranking, with a mean score of 4.06 and a standard deviation of 0.56. In contrast, the "Queen Rania Foundation for Education and

Development (QRF)" received the lowest ranking, with a mean score of 3.69 and a standard deviation of 0.65.

Table (4) shows that the field of the Jordan Education Initiative (JEI) is rated highly, with a mean score of 3.97 and a standard deviation of 0.64. Among the items evaluated, Item 2, which

states "I believe JEI has contributed to improving the quality of education in my school," received the highest rating, with a mean score of 4.11 and a standard deviation of 0.84. In contrast, Item 3, which states "The availability of technology

(computers, internet access, and educational software) impacted positively my teaching effectiveness and students' learning experiences," received the lowest rating within the high level category, with a mean score of 3.86 and a standard deviation of 0.82.

Table (5) indicates that the field of the Queen Rania Teacher Academy (QRTA) is rated highly, with a mean score of 3.94 and a standard deviation of 0.66. Within this field, Item 7, which states "The training programs offered by QRTA are relevant and beneficial to my professional growth,"

received the highest rating, with a mean score of 4.04 and a standard deviation of 0.85. In contrast, Item 9, which states "QRTA recognizes and supports outstanding teachers effectively," received the lowest rating, with a mean score of 3.59 and a standard deviation of 0.98, indicating a medium level of satisfaction.

Table (6) shows that the field of The Madrasati Initiative is rated highly, with a mean score of 3.81 and a standard deviation of 0.55. Within this field, Item 11, which states "The Madrasati Initiative has positively impacted the overall learning environment in our school," received the highest

rating, with a mean score of 4.04 and a standard deviation of 0.82. In contrast, Item 14, which states "The Madrasati Initiative has contributed to enhancing student engagement and motivation," received the lowest rating, with a mean score of 3.58 and a standard deviation of 0.91, indicating a medium level of satisfaction.

Table (7) shows that the field of the Edraak Initiative is rated highly, with a mean score of 3.78 and a standard deviation of 0.75. Within this field, Item 18, which states "The quality of the educational materials on Edraak is high," received the highest rating, with a mean score of 3.88 and a

standard deviation of 0.91. Conversely, Item 20, which states "Edraak offers valuable professional development opportunities for educators," received the lowest rating within the high level category, with a mean score of 3.70 and a standard deviation of 0.93.

Table (8) shows that the field of the Queen Rania Foundation for Education and Development (QRF) is rated highly, with a mean score of 3.69 and a standard deviation of 0.65. Within this field, Item 25, which states "QRF's resources and programs are accessible and beneficial to educators across different regions of Jordan," received the highest

rating, with a mean score of 3.91 and a standard deviation of 0.97. In contrast, Item 22, which states "QRF initiatives have positively impacted teaching methods and student learning outcomes in my school," received the lowest rating within the high level category, with a mean score of 3.43 and a standard deviation of 0.97, indicating a medium level of satisfaction.

Table (9) shows that the field of the Queen Rania Award for Excellence in Education (QRAEE) is rated highly, with a mean score of 4.06 and a standard deviation of 0.56. Within this field, Item 25, which states "I believe QRAEE plays a significant role in enhancing the status of teaching as a profession in Jordan," received the highest rating, with a mean score of 4.37 and a standard deviation of 0.86. In contrast, Item 26, which states "The Queen Rania Award for Excellence in Education (QRAEE) effectively recognizes and celebrates outstanding educators," received the lowest rating within the high level category, with a mean score of 3.89 and a standard deviation of 0.87.

These results can be attributed to several key factors that highlight her significant impact on the educational landscape. Firstly, Queen Rania's proactive approach to initiating and supporting educational reforms has been instrumental in modernizing Jordan's education system. Her establishment of programs such as the Queen Rania Award for Excellence in Education (QRAEE) and the Queen Rania Foundation for Education and Development (QRF) demonstrates a commitment to fostering high standards and recognizing outstanding contributions to education. These initiatives have not only improved educational practices but also motivated educators by acknowledging their achievements, thus contributing to the high ratings of her role.

Additionally, Queen Rania's focus on professional development for educators has been a crucial element in the high evaluation of her efforts. The Queen Rania Teacher Academy (QRTA), for example, provides valuable training and resources tailored to the needs of teachers. This emphasis on enhancing teachers' skills and effectiveness has been widely appreciated and has positively influenced the quality of education in Jordan. By investing in professional growth, Her Majesty has ensured that educators are well-equipped to deliver high-quality instruction, further bolstering the perceived success of her initiatives.

Moreover, Her Majesty's initiatives have addressed diverse educational needs, demonstrating a comprehensive approach to improving education. Programs like the Madrasati Initiative, which aims to enhance the learning environment in schools, and the Edraak Initiative, which offers high-quality educational materials, reflect her dedication to addressing various aspects of education. This holistic approach ensures that different challenges within the educational system are tackled, contributing to the overall positive assessment of her role.

Finally, Queen Rania's efforts in promoting gender equality and supporting female educators have also played a significant role in the high rating of her contributions. Her initiatives have been noted to positively impact female educators and students, highlighting her commitment to creating

an inclusive and supportive educational environment. This focus on empowering women in education aligns with broader goals of equity and excellence, further enhancing the appreciation of her role in advancing Jordan's education system.

Findings and Discussion Related to the Second Question.

Question (2) "How have Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah's initiatives impacted the educational system, specifically from the perspectives of teachers?" To answer the question, the interviews were carried out.

The findings of the study revealed that Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah's initiatives have had a transformative impact on the educational system in Jordan. Each initiative has been designed to address specific needs within the education sector, leading to tangible benefits for educators.

Jordan Education Initiative (JEI): JEI has revolutionized classroom teaching by introducing technology and digital tools. Teachers have found that these resources facilitate more interactive and engaging lessons, which enhance student learning. The initiative also supports ongoing training for teachers, helping them integrate technology effectively into their teaching practices.

Queen Rania Teacher Academy (QRTA): QRTA's professional development programs have been highly impactful for teachers. The Academy's focus on contemporary teaching methods and leadership skills has empowered educators with new techniques and strategies, improving their ability to manage classrooms and support student development. Teachers appreciate the comprehensive training and resources provided by QRTA, which help them stay current in a rapidly evolving educational landscape.

Madrasati Initiative: By refurbishing schools and improving infrastructure, the Madrasati Initiative has created more conducive teaching

environments. Teachers have reported that better classroom conditions and updated facilities positively affect their teaching experience and student engagement. The initiative's emphasis on community involvement has also strengthened support networks for teachers.

Edraak: As an online educational platform, Edraak has provided teachers with valuable resources and opportunities for professional development. RECOMMENDATIONS

Based on the study, the following recommendations can be taken into accounts:

3. Foster partnerships with international educational organizations to bring in new ideas and resources.
4. Support educational research and innovation to continuously improve teaching methods and learning outcomes.

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
